Re: Seawall Reconstruction along Snickett Park

A number of residents on Boulevard, Windward Lane and Burly Place have expressed concerns regarding the heavy damage to the seawall caused by natural denudation by the Ocean waves. One section in particular has eroded to the point that during strong storms the ocean waves actually wash beyond the park walkway bringing driftwood onto the lawn of the house next to the eroded seawall.

We realize that rebuilding the seawall properly is an expensive endeavor, but feel, that at a minimum, reconstruction of the seawall should be an ongoing program. The former Mayor acknowledged the need to rebuilding the seawall and said it would begin in 2009.

We ask that the section causing continual erosion be remedied as soon as possible. This will save the cost of expensive work in the future. And that indigenous plants removed during the process of reconstruction be replaced as was done in the other sections of the seawall.

Thousands of residents and visitors walk the Boulevard annually. The tourist dollars they contribute to the District are substantial. We need to ensure the seawall reflects the pride we take for living in the District of Sechelt Please let me what you plan to do so I can inform the residents in the area.
